The numbers at face to face sessions are slowly improving and online bridge is here to stay! Even though the latest variant of Covid has been around in 2023, thankfully the impact has been small compared to the previous three years.

There are great initiatives by the ABF to help the Bridge community meet other players and to compete against other players without having to travel. The ABF has continued the ABF Teams Knockout on RealBridge, with an increasing number of participating Clubs in all categories. The ABF also run the Nationwide Pairs, now face-to-face (remember the online version during Covid), twice a month, again with an increasing number of Clubs and participants.

The InterClub Teams event was hosted by Canberra Bridge Club this year, with an excellent turn out. Next year it will be at Cootamundra, who also hold their annual congress each September. These country congresses are great events to support and participate in.

The annual Canberra in Bloom congress starts at the end of September. Numbers are getting back to pre Covid rates with a considerable number from interstate.
